- 12. <u>Describe</u> how the *Doppler Effect* applies to light. What two things does it show us about stars?
- 13. <u>Diagram</u> and <u>explain</u> how primary and secondary rainbows are formed. SHOW YOUR METHOD OF SOLUTION TO THESE PROBLEMS, (The 1, 2, 3, 4).
